Session 1: 5 weeks

- **God's Motives** (The gracious divine intention for us to live with the King in His Kingdom)
- **Prisoners of War** (Satan has held mankind captive with the seduction to sin and deception of lies)
- **Jesus our Savior and Deliverer** (Jesus was crucified and rose again to provide entrance into the Kingdom)
- **Breaking Free** (Repenting, Believing & Receiving are keys to freedom in Christ)
- **Fun & Fellowship Night** (Each group will decide what they want to do.)

Session 2: 5 weeks

- **Fishers of Men** (The call of being a co-laborer of Christ, Making Disciples)
- **Spiritual Conversations** (How to engage our culture and ask great questions)
- **Ambassadors putting Jesus on Display** (Good Works, Godly Character, Miracles)
- **Testimonies and Truth** (the power of testimonies and Ambassadors declaring God's opinions/truth)
- **Fun & Fellowship Night** (Each group will decide what they want to do.)

THE GOSPEL INGREDIENTS

- **Lost Humanity:** All are lost and enslaved to sin and destined for the Lake of Fire
- **God's Heart:** A Loving Father God, Creator of all life reaching out to reconcile all
- **Satan's Fury:** A devious & evil enemy of God oppressing & inflicting pain upon God's creation
- **God's Rescue Mission:** A Son on a Heavenly Mission on behalf of God for mankind to reveal the Kingdom of God and to seek and save lost humanity
- **The Ultimate Sacrifice:** A Cross where the Son would sacrifice His life to ransom mankind from the eternal consequences of sin
- **Resurrected King:** An empty tomb where the Son's victory as Lord of all would be revealed & proclaimed over sin and death
- **God's Truth Declared:** God draws people to Himself by His grace and by declaring the truth of the Good News
- **Blind Eyes Opened:** The lost prisoners believe the truth, repent of their sins against God and each other, place their faith in the Son and receive the gift of salvation
- **Transformed Lives:** Each person receives the Holy Spirit into their hearts through faith in Jesus becoming a new creation, receiving a new destiny and becoming a child of God and citizen in the Kingdom of God



WEEK 1: GOD'S MOTIVES (for Salvation & Sharing the Gospel)

OVERRIDING THOUGHT: God has a motive and purpose in everything He does! His love and intended destiny for mankind are what motivated God to send Jesus and reconcile the world to Himself! God, who is love, wants us to be with Him in His Kingdom forever. God created us and has always had a wonderful eternal purpose for His creation. God's motives are not the Gospel message, but are crucial for understanding the purpose of the Gospel!

LOVE (to know the love of God and live in the love of God through relationship with God)

John 3:16-17 “For this is how God loved the world: He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent His Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through Him.

Ephesians 3:19 and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God.

2 Thessalonians 2:16-17 Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us eternal comfort and good hope by grace, comfort and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word.

John 3:1 See how great a love the Father has bestowed on us, that we would be called children of God; and *such* we are.

John 17:23 I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me, and loved them, even as You have loved Me.

Jeremiah 9:24 but let him who boasts, boast of this, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the Lord who exercises lovingkindness, justice and righteousness on earth; for I delight in these things,” declares the Lord.

1 John 4:8 The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love.

INTENDED DESTINY (Eternal Life with God in His Kingdom)

Matthew 25:34 “Then the King will say to those on His right, ‘Come, you who are blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.’”

Romans 8:29 For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren;



Ephesians 2:7 so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

2 Peter 2:11 for in this way the entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be abundantly supplied to you.

John 17:24 Father, I desire that they also, whom You have given Me, be with Me where I am, so that they may see My glory which You have given Me, for You loved Me before the foundation of the world.

2 Peter 3:9b He (God) is being patient for your sake. He does not want anyone to be destroyed, but wants everyone to repent.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER AND DISCUSS

1. Love is the great motive of God that inspired the Gospel. From the scriptures above, identify some of the highlights and benefits concerning the love of God. How does the love of God inspire you to love others and share the Gospel with the world?
2. From the passages above, discuss and share together God's great desire and intended destiny for people. How does a deeper understanding of these truths challenge you when it comes to sharing the Gospel with the lost?
3. The most important truth to understand is that we can know God, walk with Him and abide with Him now and for eternity. When relationship is not the emphasis, Gospel truth can seem almost like a formula. How do we keep our relationship with God the focus in our lives?
4. If God's primary motives are love, relationship and eternal life with Him, how should that inform and guide our motives? [Think about this passage as you discuss: *And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to Him. For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to Himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And He gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation. 2 Corinthians 5:18-19*]
5. Identify one passage from this topic that is easy for you to remember so you can share it with others. (Remember, these passages are not the Gospel message, but are the motives of God for the Gospel)

As you close, take time to celebrate and praise God for His great love and destiny that He has for you, while lifting up all who will come to Him in faith.



WEEK 2 : PRISONERS OF WAR

OVERRIDING THOUGHT: Sin separates all of us from God and the destiny He intended for us. All people are in rebellion to God and are in spiritual darkness due to being deceived by Satan, who is blindly leading us all into the fires of eternal punishment. There are consequences for our sin and a day of judgement is coming when all mankind must stand before Jesus Christ to be judged.

ALL ARE SINNERS

Romans 3:10-12 "There is none righteous, not even one; There is none who understands, There is none who seeks for God; All have turned aside, together they have become useless; There is none who does good, There is not even one."

Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death,

Hebrews 9:27 And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this *comes* judgment,

MANKIND IS DECEIVED AND IN BONDAGE TO SATAN

2 Corinthians 4:3-4 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

2 Timothy 2:26 and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will.

1 John 5:19 We know that we are of God, and that the whole world lies in the power of the evil one.

1 John 3:8 the one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning. The Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil.

JESUS TALKS ABOUT JUDGMENT

John 3:19 This is the judgment, that the Light has come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the Light, for their deeds were evil.



John 5:21-23 For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son also gives life to whom He wishes. For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son, so that all will honor the Son even as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him.

Matthew 7:23 And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness.'

Matthew 25:41 'Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and his angels;

THE JUDGMENT OF GOD

2 Thessalonians 1:8-9 He (Jesus) will come with His mighty angels, in flaming fire, bringing judgment on those who don't know God and on those who refuse to obey the Good News of our Lord Jesus. They will be punished with eternal destruction, forever separated from the Lord and from His glorious power.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER AND DISCUSS *(There is a "Deeper Dive" section with scriptures to help you go deeper in your study and understanding.)*

1. How do these scriptures confirm or challenge beliefs that you may have held about judgment and hell? What scriptures above stand out to you?
2. Based on the truths of these scriptures, what happens to the argument of many who say "*I think I will go to heaven because I'm a good person.*"? How would you approach that mindset with someone and which scriptures above would you use to share the truth with them?
3. Discuss together the work and power of the deceiver in the lives of people who are lost? (interesting reference 2 Thessalonians 2:7-12- see below under "Deeper Dive")
4. Jesus Himself said that He would judge the nations and that the final judgment will be under His jurisdiction. One side of Jesus is loving and merciful, another facet is that He is Holy and the Righteous Judge. Discuss these seemingly conflicting aspects of the nature of Jesus Christ the Lord.
5. Identify one passage from this topic that is easy for you to remember so you can share it with others.

As you close, take time to celebrate and praise God for setting you free from the bondage of Satan and of sin & death, while lifting up all who are lost.



WEEK 3: JESUS OUR SAVIOR AND DELIVERER

OVERRIDING THOUGHT: Jesus Christ the Lord came to set the captives free, to save us from certain judgement and bring us into right standing & peace with the Father. He accomplished this as He bore our sins in His body on the cross and rose to life again on the third day. Jesus Christ paid the ransom for our freedom with His blood for all who believe. Only He can free us from the bonds of Satan and bring us to God.

Jesus Himself Declared:

Luke 4:18 ""The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, Because He anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim release to the captives, And recovery of sight to the blind, To set free those who are oppressed..."

Luke 19:10 For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

Mark 10:45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

John 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me.

John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?"

Matthew 20:18-19 "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, and will hand Him over to the Gentiles to mock and scourge and crucify *Him*, and on the third day He will be raised up."

John 8:36 "So if the Son sets you free, you are truly free."

2 Corinthians 5:19 For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to Himself, no longer counting people's sins against them.

Ephesians 1:7 In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our sins, according to the riches of His grace



Ephesians 2:13 ...now in Christ Jesus you who formerly were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us

Acts 2:36 Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ—this Jesus whom you crucified.”

1 Peter 1:18-19 knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, the blood of Christ.

Romans 8:3 The law of Moses was unable to save us because of the weakness of our sinful nature. So God did what the law could not do. He sent His own Son in a body like the bodies we sinners have. And in that body God declared an end to sin’s control over us by giving his Son as a sacrifice for our sins.

Galatians 5:1 It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER AND DISCUSS *(There is a “Deeper Dive” section with scriptures to help you go deeper in your study and understanding.)*

1. Why did Jesus have to come in human flesh, die on the cross as a sacrifice and rise again?
2. Why is Jesus the ONLY One who can deliver mankind and lead us to the Father? (reference John 14:6)
3. Why is the blood of Jesus so powerful and why is it so important?
4. What kind of freedom did Jesus come to give? What does Biblical freedom look like?
5. Why are these truths critical to the Gospel message?
6. Identify one passage from this topic that is easy for you to remember so you can share it with others.

As you close, take time to celebrate and praise God for loving you so much that He gave Jesus as your Savior and Deliverer! Praise Him and thank Him for the price that He paid to ransom us from sin and death!



WEEK 4: BREAKING FREE

OVERRIDING THOUGHT: Each person who hears the Good News has the opportunity to choose Jesus as Lord and Savior. To do so is to enter into the journey of knowing God in truth and stepping into the destiny which God has prepared for His own. Such an offer demands a response. **To Repent, Believe and Receive is what it takes on our part to Break Free.** When we do this, we begin a journey of knowing God and living in His Kingdom now and forever.

REPENT - This is a change of mind and heart that sparks new behavior. Repentance begins by acknowledging and confronting our sin, rebellion and unbelief toward God and then turning from this idolatry to serve and please the living God through faith in Jesus Christ our Lord & Savior.

Mark 1:14-15 Now after John had been taken into custody, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

Acts 17:30-31 Therefore having overlooked the times of ignorance, God is now declaring to men that all people everywhere should repent, because He has fixed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness through a Man (Jesus Christ) whom He has appointed, having furnished proof to all men by raising Him from the dead."

Acts 26:18 (Jesus speaking to the Apostle Paul identified his calling) to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me.'

Ep. 2:1-3 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest.

BELIEVE - In order to be saved, we must believe the Gospel, the Good News concerning Jesus Christ's life, death on the cross and resurrection from the dead. By doing so, we will be forgiven and have new life with God in His Kingdom. (Note: To believe is not just mental agreement, but a heart condition also. When a person truly believes, it will be evident in their life because they will seek to live a life of obedience to Christ!)



Romans 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

Hebrews 11:6 And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him.

Romans 10:8-10 But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart”—that is, the word of faith which we are preaching, that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

Acts 2:21 ‘And it shall be that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’

John 11:25-26 Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?”

John 20:31 but these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.

RECEIVE: This is where it gets real personal. Salvation is a gift from God that must be received or rejected by each and every person in the world. Each individual must make that decision as they are confronted with the truth of the Gospel! We receive the gift of salvation when we repent of our sins and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, confessing Him as our Savior and Lord. We then receive the gift of the Holy Spirit into our hearts as a seal and promise of our adoption as sons and daughters of God. This indwelling of the Spirit of God makes us a brand new person with a new identity. It is there that God’s destiny is released into our lives.

1 John 5:11-13 And the testimony is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

John 1:12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name,



1 Peter 2:9-10 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; for you once were not a people, but now you are the people of God; you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER AND DISCUSS *(There is a "Deeper Dive" section with scriptures to help you go deeper in your study and understanding.)*

1. Why is repentance critical to the Gospel message and for salvation?
2. What is the difference between Biblical believing and the world's definition of believing? Why is this understanding so important when sharing the Gospel?
3. Why is the step of receiving so critical? What does "receiving" really mean?
4. What difference does it make in a person's testimony when it becomes personal?
5. Receiving the Holy Spirit is the greatest gift given by the Father to those who have come to faith in His Son Jesus Christ. This was the intent of God from the very beginning. Relationship with God through the Holy Spirit is the destiny intended for those whom He loves. Discuss this thought at length.
6. Identify one passage from this topic that is easy for you to remember so you can share it with others.

the free gift of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ and
the new life you now have in the Holy Spirit!**



Week 2: Deeper Dive

John 3:17-19 God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him. “There is no judgment against anyone who believes in him. But anyone who does not believe in him has already been judged for not believing in God’s one and only Son. And the judgment is based on this fact: God’s light came into the world, but people loved the darkness more than the light, for their actions were evil.

2 Thes. 2:7-12 For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only he who now restrains will do so until he is taken out of the way. Then that lawless one will be revealed whom the Lord will slay with the breath of His mouth and bring to an end by the appearance of His coming; that is, the one whose coming is in accord with the activity of Satan, with all power and signs and false wonders, and with all the deception of wickedness for those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth so as to be saved. For this reason God will send upon them a deluding influence so that they will believe what is false, in order that they all may be judged who did not believe the truth, but took pleasure in wickedness.

Ep. 2:1-3 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest.

John 8:44 You are of your father the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth because there is no truth in him. Whenever he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own *nature*, for he is a liar and the father of lies.

1 Corinthians 6:9-10 Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor *the* covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, will inherit the kingdom of God.

Ephesians 5:5 For this you know with certainty, that no immoral or impure person or covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God

Revelation 20:10, 14-15 And the devil who deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone, where the beast and the false prophet are also; and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever. Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. And if anyone’s name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire.



2 Peter 2:9-10 *then* the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from temptation, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment for the day of judgment, and especially those who indulge the flesh in *its* corrupt desires and despise authority.

2 Peter 3:7 But by His word the present heavens and earth are being reserved for fire, kept for the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

Hebrews 10:26-27 For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a terrifying expectation of judgment and the fury of a fire which will consume the adversaries.

John 5:22 For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son,

Romans 2:5-6 But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God, who will render to each person according to his deeds

Jude 6-7 And angels who did not keep their own domain, but abandoned their proper abode, He has kept in eternal bonds under darkness for the judgment of the great day, just as Sodom and Gomorrah and the cities around them, since they in the same way as these indulged in gross immorality and went after strange flesh, are exhibited as an example in undergoing the punishment of eternal fire.

Jude 14b-15 “Behold, the Lord came with many thousands of His holy ones, to execute judgment upon all, and to convict all the ungodly of all their ungodly deeds which they have done in an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him.”

Revelation 21:27 and nothing unclean, and no one who practices abomination and lying, shall ever come into it, but only those whose names are written in the Lamb’s book of life.

Matthew 25:31-32 “But when the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne. All the nations will be gathered before Him;



Week 3: Deeper Dive

John 3:16, 18 “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. “There is no judgment against anyone who believes in him. But anyone who does not believe in him has already been judged for not believing in God’s one and only Son.”

Revelation 5:9

And they *sang a new song, saying, “Worthy are You to take the book and to break its seals; for You were slain, and purchased for God with Your blood *men* from every tribe and tongue and people and nation.”

1 Jn 1:8-9 If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Romans 8:34 who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us.

Romans 14:9 For to this end Christ died and lived again, that He might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.

1 Corinthians 15:3-4 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,

2 Thes. 2:13-14 But we should always give thanks to God for you, brethren beloved by the Lord, because God has chosen you from the beginning for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and faith in the truth. It was for this He called you through our gospel, that you may gain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Titus 3:7 For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another. But when the kindness of God our Savior and *His* love for mankind appeared, He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to *the* hope of eternal life.

1 John 1:7 but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.



Romans 2:4 Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?

1 Peter 3:18 For Christ also died for sins once for all, *the* just for *the* unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit;

Hebrews 9:27-28 And just as each person is destined to die once and after that comes judgment, so also Christ was offered once for all time as a sacrifice to take away the sins of many people. He will come again, not to deal with our sins, but to bring salvation to all who are eagerly waiting for him.

Ephesians 2:1-10 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest. But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them.



Week 4: Deeper Dive

Acts 26:20b (the Apostle Paul preached) to the Gentiles, that all must repent of their sins and turn to God—and prove they have changed by the good things they do.

Revelation 3:19 (Jesus said) Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent.

Luke 13:3 (Jesus speaking to the people seeking Him, “but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish.”

John 14:1 (Jesus said) “Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me.

Titus 3:5-7 He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to *the* hope of eternal life.

Galatians 3:22 But the Scripture has shut up everyone under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.

John 6:29 Jesus answered and said to them, “This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent.”

Psalm 145:18 The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth.

Romans 10:14-15 But how can they call on him to save them unless they believe in him? And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about him unless someone tells them? And how will anyone go and tell them without being sent? That is why the Scriptures say, “How beautiful are the feet of messengers who bring good news!”
